4 :00 pm	<p>7) Immigrant Integration Project Report</p> <p>Bob Harper reported they are working with Stanford IPL and have been doing a pilot Fall 2017 and another pilot for evening classes next month. ALLIES is critical in this project. Jaime Alvarado is going to the adult schools and speaking with staff to find out issues that immigrants face at home that become obstacles at school.</p>	INFORMATION
4 :15 pm	<p>8) Bridge Classes Report</p> <p>Bridge classes were developed in the 3-year plan to bridge academic language in career pathways for students as they transition and develop professional skills. Funding covers seven program areas – four of which are CTE. At colleges they are noncredit, free classes. Transition Specialists advise and refer students to these classes as well as any necessary services/resources.</p> <p>Transition Specialist, Gina Riccitelli shared on Evergreen Valley College classes, Surveying and Geomatics and Engineering along with the Auto class at East Side. They are setting up tours at the colleges and focusing on pre and post CASAS testing.</p> <p>Transition Specialist, Monica Sain shared on the ESL for Childcare at Mission college coming soon. This is a credit class and tuition assisted.</p> <p>Rob Gamble shared on Mission College’s partnership with Santa Clara Adult Education and their child care classes along with training where hotels send employees along with mentors on site for ESL and Culinary Arts training, so information gets transferred back to the work site.</p> <p>Phil Crawford shared on the pre-apprenticeship program at San José City College in partnership with Building Trades and Working Partnerships, USA. They will also begin to offer this at Adult Education sites along with a noncredit bridge Justice Studies program and noncredit welding certified program.</p> <p>Mae Conroy shared that West Valley is offering Basic Skills in English co-enrolled classes at CACE.</p> <p>Gloria Curd shared that Silicon Valley Adult Education is offering Stenography and Water Treatment Distribution bridge courses with West Valley College.</p>	INFORMATION
